

Data Protection Declaration for the Study "Evaluation of Novel Programming Learning Tools"

The University of Graz and the Graz University of Technology as joint controllers take data protection very seriously and treat your personal data confidentially and in accordance with the statutory regulations. This Data Protection Declaration aims to inform you as a study participant in accordance with Articles 12 and 13 GDPR of the purpose, lawful basis and your rights regarding the processing of personal data by the University of Graz and the Graz University of Technology.

Data processed on the basis of consent will be stored until you withdraw consent. After the end of data collection and the preparation of the final dataset, the pseudo-anonymized code will be deleted. After this, the data remains in completely anonymized form. In case you withdraw consent, your data will be deleted beforehand.

Your data will only be processed within the University of Graz and Graz University of Technology; we will not transmit your data to external bodies.

You have the following rights associated with the processing of your personal data at all times, and these can be asserted in relation to the University of Graz and the Graz University of Technology as joint controller:

- right of access to the personal data in question (Article 15 GDPR),
- right to rectification (Article 16 GDPR) and erasure (Article 17 GDPR) or to restriction of processing (Article 18 GDPR),

- right to data portability (Article 20, GDPR),
- right to object (Article 21 GDPR),
- right to withdraw consent (Article 7 (3) GDPR), which shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent given before the withdrawal.

You also have the

- right to lodge a complaint (Article 77 GDPR),
